**Colorful Fabric Beads**

At the Sept. meeting we will be making Colorful Fabric Beads using drinking straws, fabric, decorative yarns, and seed beads strung on wire. These beads can be used for a necklace or bracelet, as surface embellishments for garments, as toggle closures on a purse or jacket, etc.

Supplies will be provided, or if you prefer you can bring your own fabric, decorative yarns, seed beads or other small beads, 26 or 28 gauge wire. Fabric pieces should be cut 3" long by 1 & 1/2" wide - or wider if you prefer

Items you need to bring:

Scissors

Bring a piece of cloth or something to hold all your beads while you work so they don't roll away.

**Weaving - Advanced Beginners**

(Introduction to Lace Weaves)

Meets 4 Wednesdays 10 am - 1 pm

Dates - 9/12, 9/19, 10/3, and 10/10 (no class on 10/26).

Two or more lace weaves will be covered in this 4-week session. Students will weave samples on pre-warped looms that will be cut off at the end of the sessions for their weaving record, and future reference. If desired, one of the lace weaves may be used to plan and execute a project.

The price for the 4 classes will be \$60.

A small materials fee will be charged for the yarn, and handouts.

The class size is limited to 4 students, maximum.

One or more projects will be completed during the course of instruction. While this is a beginning class, some weavers repeat the class. If necessary, there will be one make-up class at the end of the sessions.

The cost is \$90 for six classes

A \$5 materials fee is charged for notebook, handouts, and weaving items.

A \$10 fee is charged if I provide the fibers for a project.

Class is limited to a maximum of 4 students.

## **VISTA FIBER ARTS FIESTA**

The Museum Weavers of the Antique Gas and Steam Engine Museum (AGSEM) will host the second Vista Fiber Arts Fiesta on October 13-14, 2012. We urge you join us at this unique event.

Local guilds and other vendors will sell raw wool, handspun and hand-dyed yarns, handwoven articles, ethnic textiles, and tools for knitting, spinning and weaving. Vendors include weavers, gourd artists, spinners, felters, and yarn merchants. There will be demonstrations of fiber arts, easy fiber projects for visitors to enjoy, and live music. Food can be purchased on site.

This year's event will be bigger and better than last year! We have sold all our available booth spaces.

The **San Diego County Spinners** will do a demonstration of the International Back to Back Wool Challenge. A team of 7 spinners will spin wool and knit a sweater. The Challenge is a timed event, so the San Diego County Spinners will be working against the clock to try to improve their time in this demonstration event. Shearing the sheep will take place off-site.

The Antique Gas and Steam Engine Museum is located at 2040 North Santa Fe, Vista CA 92083. The Vista Fiber Arts Festival will be open from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Admission and parking are free.

If you would like to come and demonstrate your fiber arts skills, such as spinning or weaving, you are welcome to do so. There will be a Spinning Corral. However, no selling without having a booth and a sales permit.
