Join Kathleen Waln as she discusses her work with the resist dye technique of shibori. She will have many examples of hand-tied traditional Japanese shibori for you to see and touch. Kathleen will explain how these intricate dyed patterns are created. These glorious shibori fabrics can be recreated on the loom with "Woven Shibori," a technique originally created by Catherine Ellis. She will demonstrate the techniques of shibori woven on the loom and discuss how you can create these lovely fabrics on your looms at home. Kathleen would like to invite any creators of shibori, woven or otherwise to bring in your samples. For instance, last year Dianne Totten taught a variation on the shibori theme. We can discuss and demonstrate all the many facets of the exciting world of shibori.

(Introduction to Lace Weaves)

Meets 4 Wednesdays 10 am - 1 pm

Dates - 9/12, 9/19, 10/3, and 10/10 (no class on 10/26).

Two or more lace weaves will be covered in this 4-week session. Students will weave samples on pre-warped looms that will be cut off at the end of the sessions for their weaving record, and future reference. If desired, one of the lace weaves may be used to plan and execute a project.
