Beginning October 14, 15, 16

Beginning Weaving classes on 2 or 4-shaft looms will be offered starting October 14, and will be completed before Thanksgiving. These classes are for beginning weavers, or new weavers who still need some guidance.

A session consists of six 3-hour classes and will cost \$90.

A \$10 materials fee will be charged if yarn is supplied.

Some looms are available for rental at \$10/month.

Classes are limited to 4 students.

One or more projects will be completed during the course of instruction, but will require doing some weaving at home. Classes are conducted in my studio located in Redlands, and require a membership in the Inland Empire Handweavers Guild (IEHG).

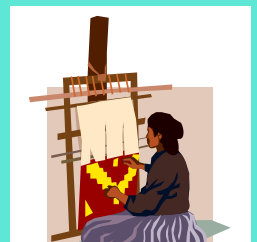

## STENCILING and STAMPING

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The only limitation to what you can do is your imagination! Almost anything can be used as a stamp and almost any idea can be made into a stencil. So we are including a list of things for you to bring to make this day fun and exciting! We will also bring some of the tools etc. for those who do not have them at home.. it is always easier to have your own tools and materials so that you are not waiting to share them.

Janet will discuss positive and negative use of space, reversal of letters and numbers, the importance of connectors and a little on color mixing. We will be using acrylic paint which is permanent once dry. We don't want her to talk too much so we can get to the *fun!!!*

### **Things to Bring:**

#### **Tools:**

- Xacto knife
- Heavy cardboard or magazine to cut on
- Pencil and ball point pen
- Spray bottle with nice mist and a “pint” size water container (to keep the brush wet)
- Foam brushes, old toothbrush, “stenciling brush”(bristles are blunt cut), cut up old sponge
- Protective clothing... apron – old shirt...etc and gloves (opt. if you like paint on your hands)
- pieces of fabric and/or variety of paper even tissue paper

#### **For Stamping:** Ready made stamps and...

- Gum or pink erasers
- Styrofoam plates
- Potato cut in half (either way) the night before and left out to dry (not in a baggie)
- Onion cut in half (either way) the night before and left out to dry (not in a baggie)
- Other vegetables and fruit will also create interesting patterns when stamped they just need to be dry so as not to transfer juice to your fabric and so that they stamp a clear design.
- Leaves
- bottle and jar lids, washers, cookie cutters... explore the garage!
- even shoe soles with interesting patterns! GET CREATIVE!

**For Stenciling:** Ready made stencils and...

- Heavy paper or card stock
- leaves
- masking tape
