IEHG 2015 Fall Weaving Classes

Weaving for Beginners and Beyond

This class covers weaving on two types of looms:

- 1) Those that have movable shafts controlled by levers or treadles and
- 2) The rigid heddle loom.

The class is designed for:

- 1) Students who have no weaving experience,
- 2) Former weavers that have not woven in a long time and need a refresher course,
- 3) Weavers who still need some guidance, and
- 4) Weavers interested in broadening the scope of their weaving.

A session consists of **six 3-hour classes**. A proposed Fall sessions is listed below.

At least one project will be completed during the course of instruction, but will require doing some weaving at home. **Class size is 3-4 students.**
